LCIF/SightFirst Committee
Fourth District Cabinet Meeting
Jay's Seafood, Albemarle
March 23, 2005

The tsunami disaster in South Asia prompted a tremendous outpouring of support from Lions worldwide, and the Lions in the affected areas worked day and night to bring essential supplies to victims.

The LCIF \$5 million matching donation comes half from LCIF reserves and half from Lions for tsunami relief. To date, LCIF has received more than \$3.5 million in donations and Lions' districts have pledged more that \$3 million. Lions in the U.S. have donated \$2.2 million.

Even as Lions in South Asia continue to work long hours providing relief camps with vital supplies, LCIF is energetically working with South Asian Lions on long-term recovery plans. Together with committees of leading Lions, plans are being made to rebuild homes, schools and orphanages.

The Lions Club of Colombo Mid City, Sri Lanka is building 500 houses for the families living with children who have lost shelter. The Government of Sri Lanka has agreed to provide land in different districts of the Island. They plan to build 50 houses with a child care center in each district. They plan to have all construction completed within six months from the date of receiving funds. I have instructions if you, your club, church, or company would like a house or community named after you.

Long after the TV news crews have left, long after the attention of the world is elsewhere, LCIF and Lions will be on the ground in South Asia making sure communities are rebuilt. In many instances the local Lions will aid tsunami victims in remote or underserved regions that other aid organizations will bypass, those who would otherwise have to fend for themselves.

An LCIF-funded eyeglass mission to South Asia has shown the kind of results we can quickly achieve. A 12 member team distributed 25,000 pairs of glasses and taught Sri Lankan Lions how to use two donated lensometers and run an eyeglass recycling operation. This will allow them to use the additional 50,000 pairs already sent there.

Donations to LCIF are a highly efficient and effective way to help. Every dollar donated goes directly to relief efforts; LCIF's administrative costs are paid for by interest on investments.

Donations for tsunami relief from Dec. 26, 2004, to Mar. 31, 2005, are eligible for MJF recognition. This must be donations of the full \$1,000 MJF donation but the person doesn't have to be named at the time the donation is made.

SightFirst has been very effective. On average, about every \$6 in donations has resulted in a person with vision restored or saved from blindness.

SightFirst has launched the world's first-ever global initiative to combat childhood blindness. The project is creating 30 centers for pediatric eye care around the world.

Virtually no new cases of river blindness are being reported in areas with widespread treatment coverage, and the disease could be eliminated in Latin America by 2010.

LCIF approved 24 SightFirst grants for \$2.6 million in January. The grants will help hundreds of thousands of people in 13 nations preserve their sight or have their vision restored. The grants fund cataract surgeries, upgrade Lions' eye hospitals, expand ophthalmic training programs and control eye disease such as trachoma.

Your club's delegates will be voting on these issues for you. Please discuss them so they can know how to cast their vote for your club.

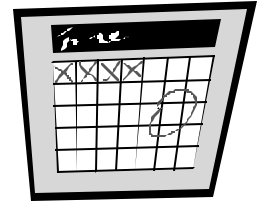
