### **GOVERNOR'S COMMENTS**

The cabinet meeting is over and at long last, I would like to congratulate Lion H. Gordon McAdams for his election as Vice District Governor for the Lions year of 2007-2008. He has been a hard working Lion in the Davidson County Area for quite some time and I know he will do a great job for the District. He has several role models in Davidson County to call on for help, in the form of Past District Governors Lions Bennie Pugh, Dr. Jerry Bates, Allan Thompson, David Miller, S. Aldeen Robbins, Fred Plummer, David Smoot and last but not least Lion Willie Welborn. I hope I haven't left anyone out because there are so many PDGs and other well informed Lions in the Davidson County area. If he follows this list, he will have "LARGE SHOES" to fill.

The annual "visits to clubs" is now over. That does not mean my work is done. In fact, my work is just beginning. As a District, we have several new members spread over the entire District and one new branch club. We are working to expand some of the existing clubs with branch clubs and trying to form one or two new clubs. April 19, 20 and 21 we are going to have a representative from Lions Clubs International come to the Mt. Pleasant Lion's Den and teach us how to approach businesses, individuals and organizations to get new members. The first two days will be about getting new members and clubs going and the third will be training for "Certified Guiding Lions". This is some intense training and well worth the time you will be asked to take. Do you have to attend all sessions? The answer is, "No". Any amount of training you can get is more information than you had. During this training, we will actually split into teams and go into the community and approach individuals about joining Lion's Clubs. Sounds like a lot of work but a lot of fun also. Will some have to take time off work to attend all sessions? The answer is, "Yes". I have already given notice at work that I will be taking some time off for this training. I don't get paid for this but I feel it is well worth the effort. At the end of the sessions and the third day of training, I will be signing the paperwork and sending it to International for certification of all who attend the "Guiding Lion" training.

I have not been doing such a great job as far as getting the word out for two major efforts of Lions: White Cane and Campaign Sight First II. Several clubs have been working hard to raise the money to better their last year's effort. I don't have to remind all of you what "White Cane" does for the people of North Carolina. If we have no White Cane, we have no services for the visually impaired. This is our main goal and we need to keep this in mind, as we take the time to raise the funds needed. The other major effort is Campaign Sight First II. I am proud to announce that Lions world wide have raised \$75,000,000.00, half of the goal for this fine cause. Remember, this is a three year project and it's not necessary raise all of the money at once. I encourage each club to call their Campaign Sight First II Group Coordinator and request a Sight First II program.

**PAY CLOSE ATTENTION**

Several of the clubs in the District have outstanding balances with Lions Clubs International. It seems that in the past this has been an accepted practice. Starting July of 2007, Lions Clubs International will not allow this to happen. If an outstanding balance is held over, the charter can and they say, "Will be pulled". Why should any club take the chance to have their charter pulled? I encourage all clubs to start now. Look at the balance your club has and get it up to date. We have worked hard to get a positive year going, so let's not take a chance of letting it fall apart, now. I receive a list of the clubs with an outstanding balance each month and I encourage each of you to catch them up. Last year there were several presidents qualifying for 100% president but with overdue balances they did not get it.

Now back to topics that have been discussed at the cabinet meetings. As you know by now, we have what I would consider a big loss for the Lions of the State. District "C" has voted to dissolve the District and distribute their membership within the surrounding Districts. Under a ruling from International, the membership can only be divided between two Districts, due to the size of the District. For the past several years, we have been told not to worry about numbers. Now we see what can happen if we do not worry about numbers. We need to take this as a lesson to what can happen if we get too comfortable with the numbers we see. I ask all members to read the State Newsletter article so their delegates can make an educated vote at the State Convention. Remember, District C is the only district in the state that has had an International President and they have had two. Jack Stickley and Bill Woolard both came from the same Lions Club in District C. This resolution WILL BE IN THE STATE NEWSPAPER. I ENCOURAGE EACH AND EVERY ONE OF YOU TO DISCUSS IT WITH YOUR CLUB MEMBERS AND MAKE SURE YOUR DELEGATES ARE INFORMED. At the last cabinet meeting, it was voted on to allow every Lion in good standing, who is a member of a club in good standing, who attends a cabinet meeting, a vote on all matters of the general nature.

March 28, 2007

District 31E Governor Lion Morris VanVleet called the meeting to order, Vice District Governor Lion Sydney Eudy lead the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Chaplain Lion Clarence Williford PDG gave the invocation.

Governor Lion Morris recognized Past District Governors, Melvin Jones Fellows, Jack Stickley Fellows and William L. Woolard - Partners-in Service.

Tail Twister Lion Chris Beck entertained us with jokes and collected \$142.00 for White Cane.

Lion Harvey Whitley PCC was appointed Parliamentarian.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes as printed, and was approved.

Lion B. A. Smith made a motion, seconded by Lion Butch Conrad to accept the financial report as printed, the motion was approved.

The nomination of Lion Gordon McAdams for Vice District Governor for the Lion's year 2007-2008 was read.
