### Secretary's Corner

**Reduce your member's dues** by certifying the families in your club. Many club secretaries have not done this and it is an easy process that will reduce the dues your husband / wife, father / mother / son / daughter pay. Lions Clubs International offers a reduced dues rate to these members.

#### How Does The Family Membership Dues Program Work?

The first family member (Head of Household – HH) pays the full International Dues (US\$39.00). Up to four more subsequent qualifying family members over the age of majority in the same household and the same club pay one-half of the standard annual dues (US\$19.50). This is a permanent program which has been ratified as part of the Lions Clubs International Constitution.

#### Who Qualifies?

This program applies to existing and new Lions in and/or joining the same club and living in the same household related by birth, marriage and other legal means - such as parents, children, spouses, aunts/uncles, cousins, grandparents and in-laws of spouses.

The club secretary must complete the online family unit certification form verifying family unit information. Read the Online Certification Instructions for step-by-step directions to complete the form online. Club Secretaries who file WMMR reports may verify their family units by printing the Family Unit Report from the REPORT section of the WMMR site.

**Secretaries who file by paper:** Submit the printable Family Unit Certification Form with the Monthly Membership Report (MMR) in which the new member or a family unit is being reported. Download the form for complete instructions. If you are unable to obtain the form online, please contact me and I will see that you get a copy of the form.

**Reminders:** All **Monthly Membership Reports** must be postmarked by the 3rd day of the following month. Email, or print and mail, one copy of MMR to the District Governor with a copy of the Points Sheet and club newsletter. You may report club activities at the bottom of the Points Sheet or on a separate sheet.

Send one copy of each Points Sheet to the Vice District Governor and your Zone Chair.

If your club publishes a **Club Monthly Newsletter**, please email or send a copy to the District Bulletin Chairperson Lion Theresa Matthews at either PO Box 788, Denton, NC 27239-0788 or at [mkmsales@mindspring.com](mailto:mkmsales@mindspring.com).

If you were unable to attend the **Secretary's Training School**, please contact me and I will send you a CD containing a copy of the presentation along with forms found on the District, NCLF and Lions Clubs International websites you will need this year.

**Secretaries** please review your club's records on the Lions Club International membership Website. When you sign in, click the **Membership** tab and select **Review Members Information** and verify that the names, addresses, and phone numbers of your members are correct. Also go to the **Club** tab

and select **Club Officers** to make sure the officers for your club are up to date and correct.

**DISTRICT 31-E CABINET MEETING MINUTES**  
**Harrisburg Presbyterian Church**  
**Harrisburg, NC**  
**July 14, 2007**

- **Call to Order:** District Governor Sydney Eudy called the meeting to order at 3:00PM.
- **Roll Call:** 73 members representing 24 clubs from District 31-E and 2 visitors from District 31-C attended the meeting.
- **The Pledge of Allegiance:** PDG Willie Welborn.
- **Invocation:** Chaplain Harvey Whitley
- **Parliamentarian:** PDG Fred Plummer
- **Governor Eudy recognized the District Tail Twister,** Lion Harvey Whitley, who told jokes & fined DG Eudy for not beginning the meeting on time. TT Whitley then called upon Lions Chris Beck and Clarence Williford to assist in administering fines to the assembled members. DG Eudy in turn challenged TT Whitley to collect 10 times the amount of the fine he charged her for being late and to give those collected fined to CSFII.
- **The Minutes of the June Cabinet Meeting** was presented for approval. PCC Diane Whitley who was acting secretary at the May meeting advised everyone that there were two corrections to the minutes: 1) Paragraph 7 should read "Hearing Budget" and 2) the amount of the motion should be changed to read, \$2,000.

**Motion:** Lion Betty Hinson made a motion to accept the minutes as corrected. PDG George Ohm seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

- **Financial Report 2006-2007:** Governor Eudy reported that the financial records are being audited and Past Cabinet Sec/Treas Nancy Rummage has no report at this time.

**Motion:** Lion Clyde Rummage moved to present the end of year financial report at the October Cabinet Meeting. PDG Bennie Pugh seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

- **2007-2008 Budget:** PDG Van Vleet presented the budget for 2007-08 (Attachments a & b). Questions were raised concerning the payment of the Governor Elects airline ticket. PCC Whitley reported that LCI has modified the rule concerning payment of expenses to Transitional Districts. Beginning in 07-08, LCI will reimburse expenses for spouses of Governor Elects who attend the International Convention. The District must submit a request to LCI to receive payment.

**Motion:** PDG Pugh moved to approve the budget as presented. The motion was seconded by PDG Harvey Whitley and unanimously approved.

- CS/T Staley reported that the cost of printing the district directory will exceed the amount budgeted. The cost will be \$1,584.72 for 400 copies.

**Motion:** PDG Aldeen Robbins moved to approve payment of the directories. PDG Jim Walker seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

- **Bond for Cabinet Secretary/Treasurer:**

**Motion:** PDG Jim Walker moved to approve payment of the bond for Cabinet S/T Staley. PDG Ohm, State S/T reported that the \$50.00 budgeted would be adequate to cover payment. The motions was seconded by PDG Dale Dupree and unanimously approved.

- **Depository for District Funds:** Cabinet S/T Staley asked for approval to use SunTrust Bank as depository for the District's funds.

**Motion:** PDG Pugh moved to accept the recommendation. The motion was seconded by PDG Clarence Williford and unanimously approved.

- **Report on International Convention:** DG Eudy reported that she and husband, Lion Roger, had a very enjoyable time at the convention in Chicago. DG Eudy reported that Lion Roger had an especially good time touring with the spouses of the other District Governors from NC. PID Sid Scruggs, the NC Lions candidate for International 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President was endorsed by LCI to run for election in Bangkok at the 2008 International Convention. At this time PID Scruggs is unopposed. PDG Van Vleet, Chair of the State Promotions Committee reported that NC Lions must raise \$100,000 for his campaign fund by January. Plans for doing this will be discussed at the August State Promotions Committee Meeting in Hickory. DG Eudy also commented on the speech made by former US President Jimmy Carter. She said she was especially moved by a statue the Carter Center had done. It is of a child, using a stick to lead his blind parents through a village.

 PDG Pugh reported that he needs to receive the names of 1<sup>st</sup> Vice Presidents for all clubs that have Web Sites he maintains. Also contact PDG Bennie if any corrections need to be made to names, addresses and phone numbers listed on the District Website. The District Website contains a list of all Officer and District Chairs, as well as, a list of clubs with known websites. The District Website and NCLF website is up to date. If anyone would like to get the District emails and reports, send Bennie your email address and name and you will be added to the District distribution email list.
6. Properties Committee: Bennie Pugh, Chair

PDG Pugh reported that the new Udovich Building at Camp Dogwood has walls and a roof. Construction is moving quickly. He also reported that two new giving levels have been added since contributions have been received to furnish and build all the available rooms. A designation of Diamond contributor has been added for Individuals or an organization making contributions of \$5,000 and a Platinum Contributor level has been added for those making contributions of \$2,500 - \$4,999.99. All contributors other than those building and furnishing rooms will be listed on a bronze plaque placed either in the Lobby or on the porch as the entrance to the dormitory. You will have until 2008 to pay the pledge.

7. Zone 3: Gary Steele, Chair

Zone 3 will hold its first zone meeting on August 13 at Ryan's in Salisbury. Cleveland is holding a Blood Drive on July 26. 8. Speakers' Bureau: Ron Staley, NCLF Past President

A Speakers' Bureau has been formed and there are trained speakers in each District. The Speakers have been trained and either have or know where to get the answers to all your questions concerning the purpose and use of contributions made by Lions Clubs. The goal is to have a program in every club within the next three years. Lions Jerry Austin, Harvey Whitley, Diane Whitley and Bennie Pugh are the speakers for District 31-E. They are the resource for all the Presidents in our District. They will be contacting you to visit your club and present a program.

9. Merle Team: Lion Diane Whitley

Lion Diane presented the Merle team books to VDG McAdams along with a list of clubs that have received the books.

10. Leo Committee: Terry Cauble, Chair

Lion Terry reported that in addition to being District Leo Committee Chair, he is State Leo Committee Chair. A Leo State Convention Workshop will be held at Camp Dogwood. The dates are uncertain, but will be in September. The dates will be in the District Newsletter. Leo Liaisons are asked to get in touch with Lion Terry so information about the Leo Clubs can be verified. The dates for the Leo State Convention are being finalized.

11. Zone 6: Frank Hawfield, Chair – Attachment e

**Motion:** A motion was made by PDG Dale Dupree to accept the reports. PDG Van Vleet seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

• **Old Business:**

PDG Van Vleet reported that he is State Promotions Chair. He reported that \$40,000 must be raised by January for PID Scruggs' campaign for International 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President. The state currently has \$60,000 and the state must have a total of \$100,000 by January for the campaign. PDG Van Vleet held a raffle to raise money for the State Promotions budget with the winner receiving his/her choice of a new Lions shirt. The raffle raised \$140 less the cost of the shirt. DG Eudy drew the winning ticket and Lion Clyde Rummage was the winner.

• **New Business:**

Lion Theresa Matthews reported that the Library of Congress has talking books for the visually impaired and is currently converting talking books used by the VIP's to a digital format. Adequate funding for the conversion has not been approved and the funds that have been

approved represent only 10% of the total needed. The conversion to digital format is also in danger because money is being diverted to pay for repairing broken equipment used to support the existing tape format. Lions need to be aware of this situation in order to make elected representatives know how you feel about this issue.

- **Announcements:**

1. District Tail Twister, Harvey Whitley, reported that \$75.25 was raised for White Cane and \$75.27 was raised for SightFirst II from TT fines.
2. The 2008 International Convention will be held in Bangkok.
3. District White Cane Kick-off will be held at 630 PM, July 31 at Jay's Seafood in Albemarle. Meals are \$10.00.
4. The funeral of Donna Udovich, wife of PDG Bill Udovich, will be at Central United Methodist Church in Concord on Tuesday at 2:00 PM. The family will receive friends at Wilkinson's funeral home at 6:00 PM Monday.
5. PDG Dupree would like to know where Lions Clubs purchase brooms they sell.
6. The Concord Lions Club is holding its 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on July 21.
7. The next Cabinet Meeting will be at Camp Dogwood on Sunday, Oct. 28 at 2-4:30 PM. No meal will be served. There will be refreshments.

Lions Quest is a comprehensive youth service initiative of Lions International/Lions Clubs International Foundation that teaches youth life skills. Lions Quest provides services and resources to educators and other adults who work with youth, ages 5-19. The goal is to help build responsible and resilient youth - providing them with the tools to face and overcome life's difficulties and resist the lure of negative behaviors.

Lions Quest programs are designed to improve the lives of young people throughout the world by helping them gain positive attitudes and important life skills through easy-to-use classroom materials, solid teacher in-service experiences, and important community links.

There are three Lions Quest programs: **Skills for Growing** for elementary ages, **Skills for Adolescence** for middle school ages, and **Skills for Action** for high school ages. Some key issues addressed are: bullying, substance abuse, violence prevention, character development, community connections through service, enhanced academic performance and social and emotional learning.

Two and Three-day workshops are available and can be sponsored by an individual school, a school district, or a Lions district, with a minimum of 12 participants required and a maximum of 36. Additionally, Lions Quest offers regional two-day Combination workshops in select U.S. cities throughout the year. For regional workshops, teachers register on an individual basis and can be sponsored by a school or a Lions club.
