District Governor Sets District Goals...

District Governor Gordon McAdams has established his 2008-2009 monetary goals for District 31-E.

The District goal for Humanitarian/White Cane is \$90.00/member. This increase is needed to meet the needs of clubs in our District and other districts across the state. Last year, Clubs in our eight county District received over \$185,000 in benefits from White Cane. Our goal for the District this year is still below what we get in return for our White Cane Contributions. Other monetary goals for this year are:

- Clinical Eye Research \$4 per member
- Governor Morehead Athletic Program \$2 per member
- Youth Exchange, Youth Outreach
and Leo Clubs \$0.50 per member
- Leader Dog program \$2 per member
- Lions Clubs International Foundation \$3 per member
- Jack Stickley Fellowships \$3.50 per member
- VAVS program \$2 per member

In total, clubs would need to raise \$17 per member to meet the Governor's Monetary Goals.

In addition, Governor McAdams asks clubs to support the Camp Dogwood Raffle. Each club member is asked to sell at least three books of tickets. Selling an entire book of tickets will raise \$10, \$12 if tickets are sold separately. The North Carolina Lions Foundation will hold a drawing for a new vehicle at the 2009 state convention in Raleigh.

Governor McAdams also seeks support for the North Carolina Lions VIP Fishing Tournament. He asks each club to adopt at least one participant. Adopt-a-Fisherman forms can be downloaded at the state Web site www.northcarolinallions.org.

There was a large group of North Carolina delegates at the convention to support Sid and Judy Scruggs as he accepted the office of 2nd VP of Lions Clubs International. Lions from several other states helped us celebrate and demonstrate for Sid.

SightFirst II Goal Surpassed...

From Staff Reports

Lions Clubs International Foundation and Lions around the world have exceeded their campaign challenge goal of \$200 million for their flagship, global blindness prevention program, SightFirst. Funds raised during Campaign SightFirst II, a three-year worldwide campaign operated by the international charitable foundation, will save or restore the vision of more than 37 million people around the world. Led by 7,000 CSFII Lion volunteers, Lions surpassed their initial \$150 million goal in February, four months in advance of the campaign's conclusion. During the final month of the campaign alone, Lions raised more than \$20 million to surpass the \$200 million challenge goal.

"The efforts of Lions worldwide over the last three years makes me incredibly proud to be a Lion," says Dr. Tae-Sup Lee, Lions past international president and CSFII chairperson. "Through CSFII, our role as 'Knights of the Blind' will continue for years because of the dedication of our volunteers and all of our excellent gifts of sight."

At least \$100 million of CSFII funds will be granted through LCIF's SightFirst program to contain and eliminate the leading causes of avoidable blindness, including cataract, the leading donors. Most importantly, LCIF and Lions will be able to continue to deliver the excellent services of the SightFirst program and thereby ensure that millions of individuals around the world are able to live with the gift of sight." At least \$100 million of CSFII funds will be granted through LCIF's SightFirst program to contain and eliminate the leading causes of avoidable blindness, including cataract, the leading cause of preventable blindness worldwide. Another \$50 million will be used to combat new and emerging threats to sight, including diabetic retinopathy, macular degeneration and low vision. The funds raised beyond the \$150 million initial goal will make it possible for Lions to fund research and rehabilitation initiatives in developed countries. Lions' goal is to provide "Vision for All." SightFirst was launched by Lions in 1989.

1. Call to OrderDistrict Governor McAdams
The meeting was called to order following the Installation and Awards Banquets. Governor McAdams thanked everyone for attending.
2. Appointment of Parliamentarian..... 2nd Vice District Governor Gary Steele
3. Under District By-Laws all Lions attending are Eligible to Vote
4. Approval of Minutes of the June Cabinet Meeting
2nd VDG Steele reported two corrections need to be made to the minutes: Two instances in the minutes read “2nd Vice President Gary Steele”. The minutes should read “2nd Vice District Governor Gary Steele”. Lion Patricia Carroll moved the minutes be approved as corrected.
Motion: PDG David Shimberg seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.
5. July 2008 Financial ReportPast Cabinet Secretary/Treasurer Staley
Administrative Income to date is \$22,704 and Administrative Expense is \$20,341.10 leaving a balance of \$2,362.90. Mid-Winter Income was \$7,889 and Mid-Winter Expense was \$7,080.58 leaving a balance of \$808.42. The District began the year with \$9,443.82 in the Restricted Accounts (accounts funded by clubs’ contributions to the District Goals). Restricted Accounts income was \$20,904.50 and the District made contributions totaling \$21,332.60 to organizations supported by our goals. There is a balance of \$9,015.72 remaining in the restricted accounts. The district currently has total assets of \$38,648.90.
Motion: PDG David Smoot moved the Financial Report be accepted. PDG David Shimberg seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.
6. Approval of Bond for Treasurer
Motion: PDG Dale Dupree moved the Bond for the Treasurer be approved. PDG Clarence Williford seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.
7. Approval of Depository for District Funds 2008-2009
Cabinet Secretary Staley requested approval to use SunTrust Bank and New Bridge Bank as the depositories for District’s interest bearing and demand deposit accounts.
Motion: NCLF President Jim Walker moved to accept the recommendation and IPP Sydney Eudy seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.
8. Presentation of 2008-2009 Budget..... Cabinet Secretary Ron Staley
Motion: 2nd VDG Gary Steele moved that the proposed budget be approved. PDG John O’Malley seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.
9. Report on International Convention.....District Governor McAdams
District Governor reported that the International Convention was excellent and highly recommends everyone attend them if possible. The food was excellent, everyone felt welcome and the hotel was very good. There was a good turnout of PID Sid Scruggs campaign activities. Hope of lot of people can go next year to Minneapolis.
10. Review of District Goals & QuotasDistrict Governor McAdams
District Governor McAdams reported that the district goals are in the District Directory. There are some items that are new such as the Governor Morehead School Athletic Program. This was a program supported by clubs in District 31-C and are excellent programs. A question was raised

concerning support of the Boys and Girls Homes Inc. The Governor stated that the purpose for not listing the Boys and Girls Homes, Inc. in Wacamaw was because clubs had indicated that there were children's homes in their communities and they wished to support them. The Boys and Girls Home, Inc. was not listed so that Lions Clubs would have the freedom to support whichever children's home the club wished to support. Clubs are, however, encouraged to support the Boys and Girls Home, Inc. or other children's homes in their locale.

11. Zone and Committee Reports:

Zone Chairpersons

The members of Zone 3 started the year off on a high note. Nine members walked and drove the two hour Faith Fourth of July parade. A banner announced the North Carolina Lions as Lion Linda Van Vleet growled and waved to the adoring fans in her Lion costume while other members of the zone walked and tossed candy to many children along the packed parade route.

Following the Lions was the North Carolina Lions Vision Van. Upon completion of the parade the van was set up for an afternoon of screening. From approximately 12:30 to 4:00pm a total of 29 individuals were screened. We had on Optometrist, the Van coordinator and 18 volunteers representing 4 Lions clubs.

Our first Zone meeting is scheduled for September 29 at Ryan's in Salisbury. All members are strongly encouraged to attend this meeting as some important decisions need to be made.

- Zone 9 Zone Chair, Lion Louis Atchison

The clubs that are from what was previously District 31-C are glad to join clubs in District 31-E. In the north side of Mecklenburg County, because it is less densely populated, there are fewer requests for assistive living devices. We would like to put a mechanism in place where clubs can assist each other in purchasing these devices. We are requesting all club presidents in Zone 9 to attend the first Zone Meeting and work to get something in place where clubs can assist each other in the purchase of these assistive living devices. In addition to this, clubs in the zone are involved in fund raisers. The Davidson Lions Club would like the support of everyone for their golf tournament. South Park Lions Club is looking for people to attend a couple of theater dates. A date for the Zone meeting has not been scheduled.

District Committee Chairpersons

- Leadership Committee Committee Chair, Lion Tim Williams

The District completed the leadership training on Saturday July 12. We had an outstanding training team. A total of 15 sessions were held at 3 locations in the District. Zone Chairs, Presidents, Secretary/Treasurers and Membership Chairs were trained. There was also new member orientations held. In addition there were presentation on Campaign SightFirst II and Filing Club Tax Returns. 44 clubs were represented and the attendance was 144. 8 Zone Chair, 51 Presidents, 29 Secretaries, 20 Treasurers, and 9 Membership Chairs were trained. 13 new members and 2 potential new members were given an orientation. It was a great series of events.

- Retention/Orientation Committee Committee Chair, Lion Laraine Dupree

Good retention begins with good orientation. Lion Laraine would like to attend a zone meeting in each zone and present an introduction to Lionism for your Lions, both old and new.

- Campaign SightFirst II District Coordinator, PDG David Smoot

The District has raised approx \$100,000. A final number will be published when it is available.

- Humanitarian/White Cane Committee Committee Chair, 2nd VDG Gary Steele

A \$1,000 contribution for White Cane was received today. Committee Chair, Gary,

indicated he plans to visit the clubs in the district and would like to receive more checks when he makes his visit. PDG Williford reported there will be a White Cane Kickoff at Jay's Seafood in Albemarle.

13. New Business:

- Governor McAdams presented Nazareth Children's Home Certificates of appreciation to:
 - Salisbury Lions Club
 - Rockwell Lions Club
 - Lexington Downtown Lions Club
- Mike Schwartz, Zone Chair, for Zone 7 – Lion Schwartz reported that he had prepared an aggressive action plan for his zone. There are 140,000 people in Gaston County with an 8% increase in the last 10 years. There are only 121 Lions and 5 Lions clubs. Two clubs were lost this past year and 6 clubs have disbanded since 1990. We are in a membership crisis. We are looking to add two clubs this year, two clubs next year and one club the following year; add two Leo clubs this year, two Leo clubs next year and two Leo clubs the following year; charter one campus club this year and one campus club the next year. The goal is to keep retention to 1% or less and increase membership by 10% this year, 10% next year and 10% the following year. To accomplish this task I will be working with the Membership, Retention/Orientation and Leadership Chairs. Also I have come up with a public relations plan. The reason for coming to the District is to seek funding for a public relations grant thru Lions Clubs International. The matching grant is for advertising on television which would put out 425 ads in a four month period. The reason purchasing ads is desirable is because public ads are not run until after midnight. We are looking for people who watch television in the afternoons and evenings. We chose Time Warner Cable because it is the primary service provider for Gaston County. 46,000 households have cable in Gaston County. The plan is costs \$7.00/ad and will be run a minimum of 10 times per day. The ads will be run on Carolina News 14. Will also be working with the radio stations and the Gaston Gazette and the Charlotte Observer. The request is for a matching grant of \$3,500: \$1,750 from Lions Clubs International, \$1,500 from District 31-E and \$250 from the remaining clubs in Zone 7.

Motion: Zone Chair Schwartz moved to transfer \$1,500 from the surplus account of District to pay for matching grant. PDG David Shimberg seconded motion. The Question was called. The motion was approved.

14. Announcements
